

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING #2
FOR FUNDING UNDER THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT
(CDBG) SMALL CITIES PROGRAM**

The County of Shelby intends to apply to the Ohio Development Services Agency for funding under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Community Development Allocation, a federally funded program administered by the State. The County is eligible for fiscal year 2016 CDBG funding, provided that the County meets applicable program requirements.

On Tuesday, March 22, 2016, the County conducted its first public hearing to inform citizens about the CDBG Program, how it may be used, what activities are eligible, and other important program requirements.

Based on both citizen and local officials' assessment of the County's needs, the County proposes to review the following CDBG activities for project year 2016:

Objectivity Being Met – Benefiting the needs of low- to moderate-income persons; limited clientele; and/or preventing slum or blight.

A second public hearing will be held **May 19, 2016 at 9:00 a.m.** at the Shelby County Commissioners' Office to give citizens an adequate opportunity to review and comment on the proposed CDBG application, including the proposed activities as summarized above, before the County submits the application to the Ohio Department of Development.
